

TROOP QUARTERMASTER

1. Store and keep track of all Troop equipment. Develop and maintain a labeling system for Patrol and Troop equipment. Keep an inventory of all Troop and patrol equipment.
2. Be responsible for developing and implementing a system for checking equipment out and checking it back in on return. Make sure that returned equipment is clean and in good order or that it is repaired if not.
3. Train and counsel the Troop members (especially the Patrol quartermasters) on their role in maintaining patrol equipment.
4. Assess Troop equipment needs for outings and events (e.g., rain flies, poles, and stakes) and be responsible for getting it there and back.
5. With assistance from the Senior Patrol, oversee the annual redistribution of patrol equipment so that each Patrol has a fair share of equipment based on the make-up of the patrols each year.
6. Make suggestions for new or replacement items.
7. Take advice and direction from adult leader responsible for equipment.
8. Set a good example, especially in behavior, attendance and leadership. Attend at least 75% of all meetings and 50% of all campouts during my term of office.
9. Enthusiastically wear the uniform correctly as instructed.
10. Live by the Scout Oath and Law.

As Troop Quartermaster, I promise to do my best to fulfill the requirements of this position throughout the coming period. I understand that my performance in this position will be evaluated by the ASPL and the adult leaders on the basis of my abilities and the Job description given above, as well as the demonstration of Scout Spirit and leadership at Troop meetings and other events. As a parent, I will support my son in fulfilling these requirements for this leadership position.
